



Your role in Child Protection Conferences and Core Groups Applying Signs of Safety in practice.

Target audience

This course is recommended for **all staff working with children, young people and families** who may be required to take part in an Initial Child Protection Conference, Core Group or Review Conference.

It is an important course for all staff **new** to the child protection processes and for those with **experience** who would benefit from an update to refresh their knowledge and skills.

The course will provide an opportunity to develop practice using the Signs of Safety approach.

Course Aim

The course will provide participants with clarity about their roles and responsibilities in providing information to the safeguarding process and the part they contribute to developing and implementing safety plans.

The course will be delivered by staff with significant experience of the child protection process in Bradford. There will be a mix of presentations, exercises and a case study which participants will work through as if they were a member of a core group.

Learning outcomes

By the end of the course participants will be able to

- Describe the safeguarding process, including Section 47 Enquiry, Initial Child Protection Conference, Core Group and Review Conference
- Recognise their role in the different stages of the safeguarding process
- Demonstrate their ability to use a Signs of Safety, child focused approach
- Recognise that assessing motivation and potential for change within families is complex
